

#### Crochet Pattern



So, we know Lumote is so cute and squishy and everyone wants to take one home!

But here's the thing, we don't want produce a bunch of plushie toys that will get forgotten or worse, thrown away! We also believe that learning a new skill is fun and valuable for everyone, not unlike like solving puzzles in a puzzle game!

In the spirit of fun and learning new skills, we've produced 2 Lumote crochet patterns for you to make as many Lumotes as you like!

#### Little Lumote · 10 Hours · 9CM Tall

The Little Lumote will take probably 10 hours or more for your first one, your second one will be much faster! This little bud is a great warmup before you go off and try to make a big one!

### Big Lumote · 20 Hours · 15CM Tall

The Big Lumote will take probably 20 hours or more for your first one. It's more or less the same idea as the little one, we just have more rows to create.

### Tools

All these tools should be easy to find at your local craft store or on Amazon.

- 4mm Crochet Hook
- #13 Yarn needle
- Medium Weight Yarn (sometimes called Worsted or Aran)
  - o 1 ball of Aqua or Lime Green
  - o 1 ball of Navy or Black

## Patten short hand

Magic # Magic circle with # stitches in the first row

SC # Single crochet for # stitches

INC # Single crochet increase by # stitches
DEC # Single crochet decrease by # stitches
[Instruction] x# Repeat instructions [inside] x# of times

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## Tips

- **Keep track of your progress!** Use a little piece of yarn or a safety pin in your first stich of each row to keep track of where you started. Use a pencil and write on this pattern to keep track of which row you're on. If you walk away mid row, don't forget to write down the stich number too!
- Lumotes spots can be anything! We use crochet magic circles for Lumote's spots and stich them on with yarn. It's a great way to practice your magic circle technique before you start on your Lumote body and legs! But you can also use buttons or cut felt circles and either glue or sew them on! The general rule is that the ones in the middle column are a bigger than the ones on the sides, and the one right in the middle is the biggest!
- **Fill Lumote with whatever!** We use plain old polyester fiber fluff for filling, but you can use whatever you want. Cotton balls, your fluffy cat's fur, beans, river pebbles or anything else that won't leak out!
- **Use whatever 2 colours you want!** If you want a hot pink Lumote with yellow spots, go ahead, there's no rules.
- **Electric Lumotes!** You can swap the body to dark colours and the spots to bright colours for electrifyingly coloured Lumotes!
- Bigger Lumotes! You can make bigger Lumotes without modifying the pattern by simply increasing the size of your yarn and hook. This pattern suggests medium weight, but if you use bulky or super bulky, your Lumote will get bigger. Each ball of yarn has a recommended hook size on the label. We recommend picking a hook 1 size smaller than the label so if your yarn specifies a 5mm hook, use a 4mm to get nice tight stiches.
- **Don't be afraid of mistakes!** If you discover a mistake from 5 rows earlier, just remember, it's a handmade Lumote, each one is going to be a little different.
- You'll get better with practice! Don't give up, you'll get faster and more consistent with practice.
- This is our first pattern, we're learning things too! 2	[INC 3] <b>x4</b>	12
3	SC - [INC 3 - SC 2] <b>x3</b> - INC 3 - SC	20
4	SC 2 - [ INC 3 - SC 4 ] <b>x3</b> - INC 3 - SC 2	28
5	SC 3 - [ INC 3 - SC 6 ] <b>x3</b> - INC 3 - SC 3	36
6 – 12 (7 rows)	SC 36 – 36 Stiches per row, repeat for 7 rows	36
13	SC 2 - DEC - [ SC 4 - DEC ] <b>x5 -</b> SC 2	30
14	[SC 3 - DEC] <b>x6</b>	24
15	SC - DEC - [ SC 2 - DEC ] <b>x5</b> - SC	18
16	[ SC - DEC ] <b>x6</b>	12
17	Fill with stuffing then [ DEC ] x6 - decrease all around then pull close and weave tail into Lumote body	6

## Feet

Row	Instruction	Stiches in row
1	Magic 6	6
2	[ INC ] <b>x6</b>	12
3 - 5 (3  rows)	SC 12 – 12 Stiches per row, repeat for 2 rows	12
6	[ DEC ] x6	6

## Antenna

Row	Instruction	Stiches in row
1	Magic 6	6
2	[ INC ] <b>x6</b>	12
3	[ SC 2 - DEC ] <b>x3</b>	9
4 – 6 (3 rows)	SC 9 – <b>Left antenna</b> – 9 Stiches per row, repeat for 3 rows.	9
4 – 7 (4 rows)	SC 9 – <b>Right antenna</b> – 9 Stiches per row, repeat for 4 rows.	9
Last Row	[SC - DC] x3	6

4 - 7 (4  rows)	SC 17 – 18 Stiches per row, repeat for 4 rows	18
8	[SC 4 - DEC] <b>x3</b>	15
9	SC 15	15
10	[SC 3 - DEC ] <b>x3</b>	12
11	SC 12 – Stop after this row for all 4 feet	12
12	SC 12 – <b>Left antenna</b> – Stop after this row	12
13-16 (4 rows)	SC 12 – <b>Right antenna</b> – 12 Stiches per row, repeat for 4 rows.	12
